

1927 T&F CHAMPIONSHIP

The third ESAA championship was held on the 16th of July at Stamford Bridge. The event consisted of the same 15 events as for the previous championships.

Over 1,000 competitors from 21 counties took part. A crowd of 10,000 attended the championship.

COUNTIES

Dorset, Leicestershire, Northamptonshire, Somerset and Suffolk competed at the championship for the first time.

J. Emanuel (London) received the *E.W. Meyerstein Cup* for the outstanding performance of the day. He broke the high jump championship best by 5 inches. He was also the lead off runner in the winning relay team.

Albert Geldard (Yorkshire), 4th in the 220 yards, went on to become the first ESAA competitor to play for the **England senior football team**. He gained the first of his 4 caps in 1933.
