

1934 T&F CHAMPIONSHIP

The championship was held on the 21st of July at Blackpool Cricket Ground. It was the first time the event was held in the north of England.

The championship programme was extended with the introduction of another 4 events for the under-16s, the 220 and 440 yards for boys and the 150 yards and high jump for girls.

Over 600 competitors from 19 counties took part with the event being watched by 6,000 spectators.

Dorothy Odam (Surrey) was second in the Under-16 high jump only half an inch behind the winner but went on to become one of Great Britain's greatest athletes. She was the first SAA competitor to win an **Olympic medal, the silver in the 1936 Olympics** when she was just 16 years of age. She repeated this feat at the 1948 London Olympics.

She also won the high jump **silver medal in the 1950 European Championship** and was the **1938 and 1950 British Empire Games high jump champion**. Dorothy also won 10 WAAA titles in 3 different disciplines, namely high jump, long jump and pentathlon.
