

ESAA - WORLD YOUTH / U18 CHAMPIONSHIPS ROLL OF HONOUR

The **IAAF World Youth Championships in Athletics** were held from 1999 to 2013. In 2015 the name was changed to the **IAAF World Under-18 Championships** with the final championship being held in Nairobi, Kenya in 2017. Great Britain did not send a team to the 2017 event.
