

ESAA – SOMERSET ROLL OF HONOUR

The *Somerset Schools' Games Association* was formed in 1921 but was limited to football. In 1922 the Association decided to include athletics and, in 1923, held its first County Championship at the Huish Football Ground, Yeovil on 28th July. Only 7 schools competed with the bigger centres of Bath, Bridgewater, Frome and Taunton not sending teams. County championships were not held in 1924 and 1925.

The *Somerset Schools' Athletics Association* was then formed in 1926 with its first County Championship being held on 19th June, 1926 at Weston-super-Mare with 7 districts taking part.

In 1927 the Association affiliated to the English Schools' Athletic Association and had immediate success when Eric Milkins of St. John's Senior School, Weston-super-Mare won the 1927 ESAA Boys 100 yards title.

Eric was the reigning County champion at 100 yards, 220 yards, sprint hurdles, high jump and long jump, a superb achievement considering there were now 14 districts from all over Somerset taking part in the championship.

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MULTI-SPORT ATHLETES

Many athletes who competed in the English Schools' Athletic Association (ESAA) Championships have become very successful in a wide variety of sports including Bobsleigh, Boxing, Cricket, Cycling, Darts, Football, Hockey, Modern Pentathlon, Netball, Powerlifting, Rowing, Rugby League, Rugby Union, Skeleton, Triathlon and Weightlifting.

Details follow of four of Somerset's ESAA competitors who have gone on to have a successful career in other sports :

HOCKEY – MADDIE HINCH MBE

Maddie represented Somerset when finishing 5th in the 2006 ESAA Senior Javelin Throw event.

Only 2 years later she made her debut in goal for the England hockey team. She won a silver medal as a member of the England hockey team in the 2014 Commonwealth Games and a gold medal in the 2015 European Championship.

Maddie won Olympic Gold when the Great Britain team won in Rio in 2016 with her making a major contribution by saving all 4 penalties in the deciding shootout. She has since won bronze medals in the 2015 European Championship, the 2018 Commonwealth Games and the 2020 Olympic Games.

As of July 2022, Maddie has represented England 98 times and Great Britain 68 times.

Maddie was awarded the MBE in the 2017 Honours List.

MODERN PENTATHLON – DANNY NIGHTINGALE

Danny represented Somerset in the 1972 ESAA Senior 2000 metres steeplechase. For the previous 4 years he had already been successfully taking part in Pony Club events like the Tetrathlon (a shooting, swimming, running and horse riding variant of the Modern Pentathlon).

In 1976 he won Great Britain's first Olympic Modern Pentathlon medal, the Team Gold (with Adrian Parker and Jim Fox). He finished 10th in the Individual event. Going into the final event, the 4000 metres pursuit, the team were in 5th place. Remarkably all 3 members of the team finished in the first 6 places in the pursuit to jump into 1st place.

At the 1980 Olympics he was the Modern Pentathlon team captain and finished 15th in the Individual event. The team finished in 8th position. He also won the British title 4 times from 1976 to 1979.

Danny and Mary Rand were both given the Freedom of Wells on the same day in July, 2012.

ROWING – SARAH WINCKLESS MBE

Sarah represented Surrey when finishing third in the 1990 ESAA Inter Discus Throw event. 2 years later, representing Somerset, she finished second in the 1992 ESAA Senior Discus. Soon after, while studying at Cambridge University, she took up rowing.

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Sarah won the 2004 Olympic double sculls rowing bronze medal with her partner Elise Laverick. She followed this with wins in the women's quad event at the 2005 and 2006 World Championships. Interestingly another member of the 2006 World quad team was another ESAA competitor, Debbie Flood.

Sarah was awarded the MBE in the 2015 Honours List.

RUGBY UNION – SIR GARETH EDWARDS CBE

Gareth represented Somerset while on a scholarship at Millfield School and won the 1966 ESAA Senior 200 yards Hurdles. Although good at many sports Gareth's future was always going to be in rugby union.

He made his debut for Cardiff RFC in 1966 and within 6 months, at the age of 19, won the first of his 53 caps for Wales. His meteoric rise continued and in 1968, aged 20, he became Wales's youngest ever captain. Interestingly he never missed a Wales game in the whole of his international career from 1968 to 1978.

Gareth also played 10 times for the British and Irish Lions.

In 2007 he was awarded a CBE and knighted in 2015.
